Casa Grande and the New Almaden Quicksilver Mining Museum

Casa Grande, located within Santa Clara County's only National Landmark Historic District, preserves the history of California's first and richest mine, and provides a glimpse of life in this historic community over 150 years ago. Museum exhibits illustrate how and why cinnabar, the ore of mercury, was mined at New Almaden. Discover how cinnabar and mercury were used by people, how mining technology changed over time, and how this site contributed to the success of the California Gold Rush, Visit antique furnished rooms that reflect how Casa Grande served as an exquisite home to mine managers and their families.
